

NO SEW WONDER WOMAN COSTUME

FOR UNDER \$20

Tools you will need to make this costume:

Scissors

Pen or marker

Wax paper

DAP RapidFuse glue

(1) sheet of Dark Blue craft foam - \$0.99 ea.

(1) sheet of Light Blue craft foam - \$0.99 ea.

(2) sheets of Yellow/Gold craft foam - \$0.99 ea.

(1) sheet of Gray craft foam - \$0.99 ea.

(1) sheet of Red craft foam (can use yellow if you don't want to buy a whole sheet of red) - \$0.99 ea.

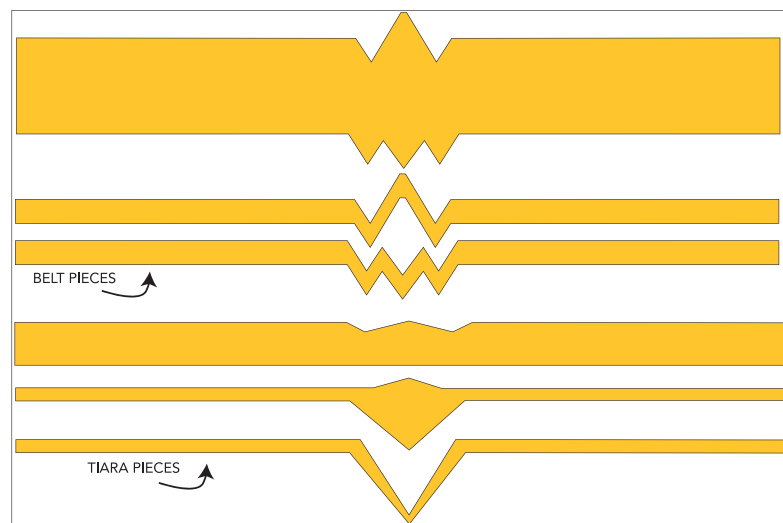
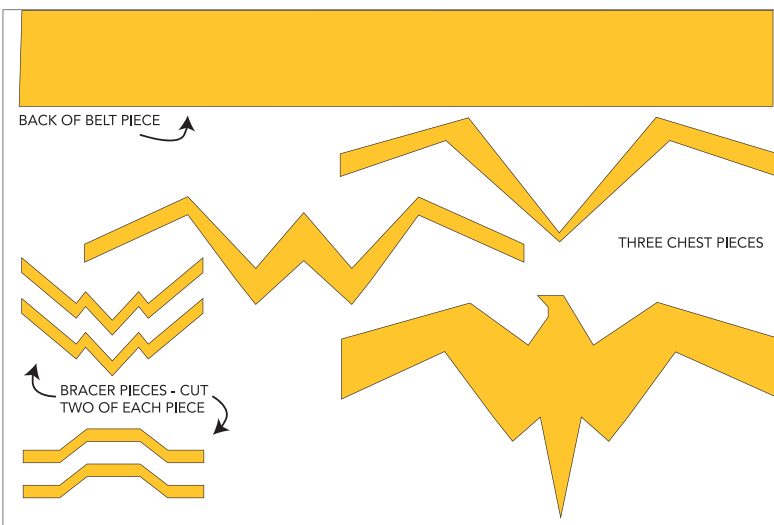
A Red T-shirt - if you don't have one, shirts can be purchased in any craft store for under \$5

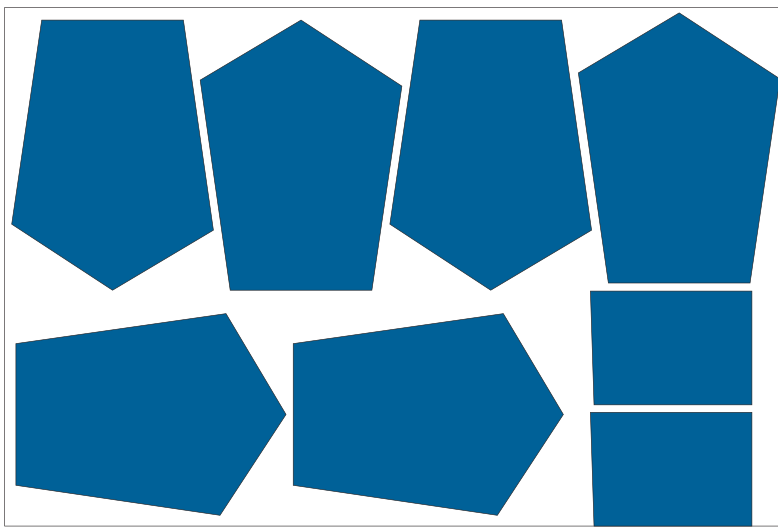
Some 1/2" wide elastic - \$1.49

Some 1/2" wide velcro - \$1.49

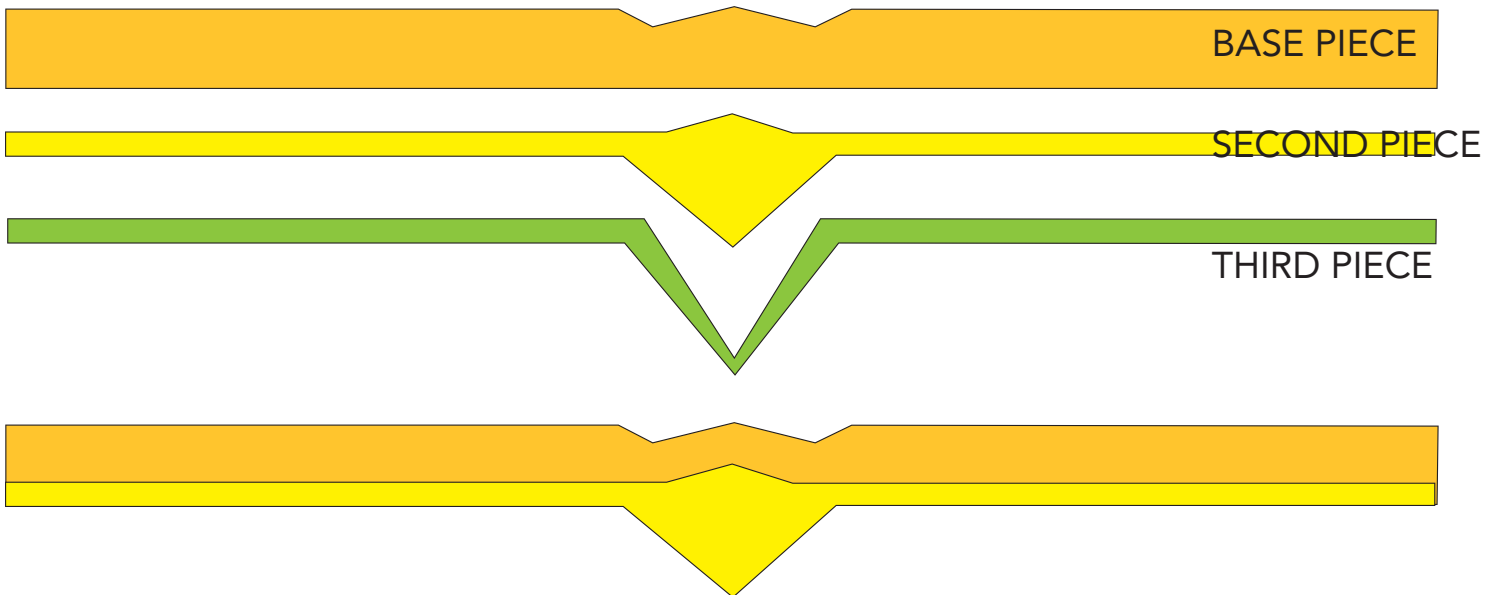
INSTRUCTIONS

1. Print out the templates and cut out all the pieces. Each piece has a name and indicates the color of foam it should be cut out of. If you don't want to purchase a red piece of craft foam just for the two sizes of stars, you can opt to use the yellow/gold foam for these instead. Trace your templates onto the craft foam using a pen or marker and cut out. If you want to use your foam as efficiently as possible, use the examples below for how to lay out your templates.

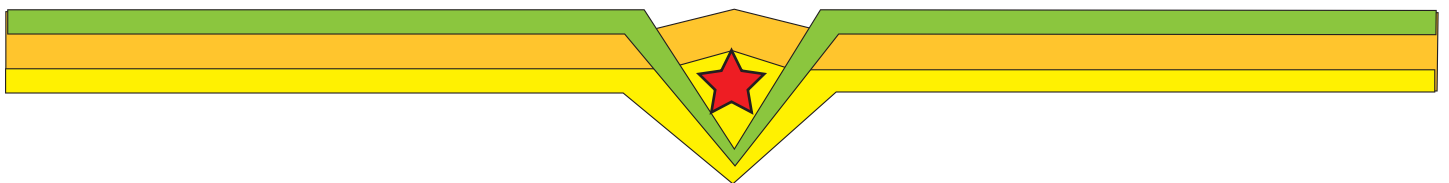




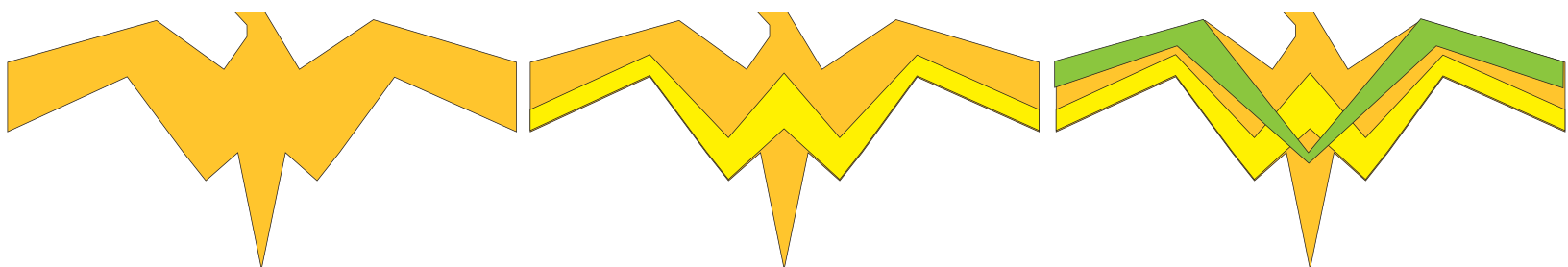
2. To put together the tiara, use RapidFuse with the brush applicator and glue your pieces together in this order: Lay the base piece down and brush RapidFuse to the back of the second piece. Line up the bottom of the base piece with the bottom of the long sides. (colors have been changed in the diagram below to more clearly show the layering only. All of these pieces should be cut from the same color of craft foam.)



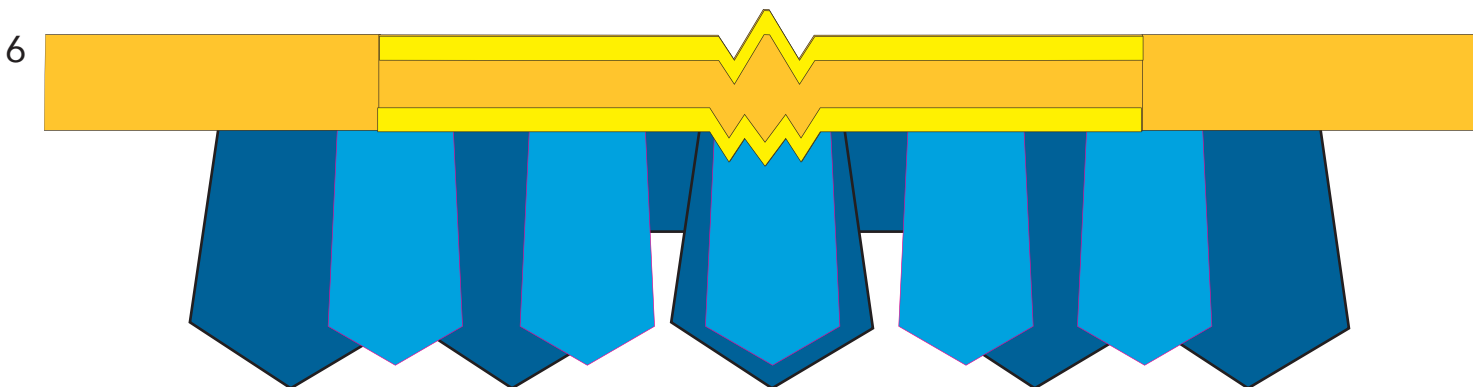
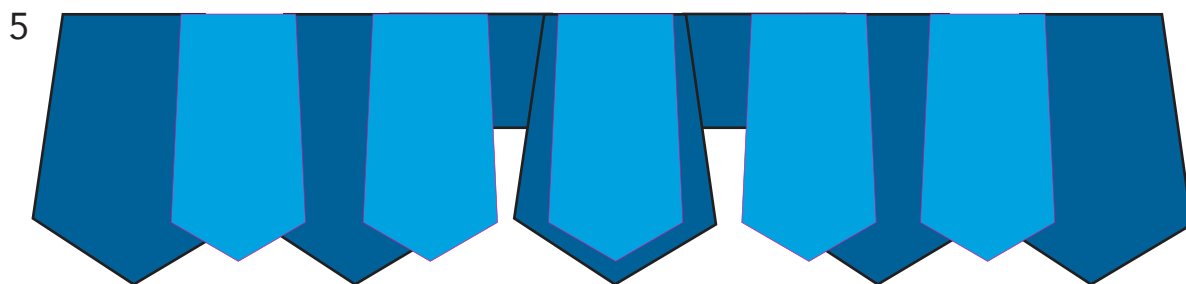
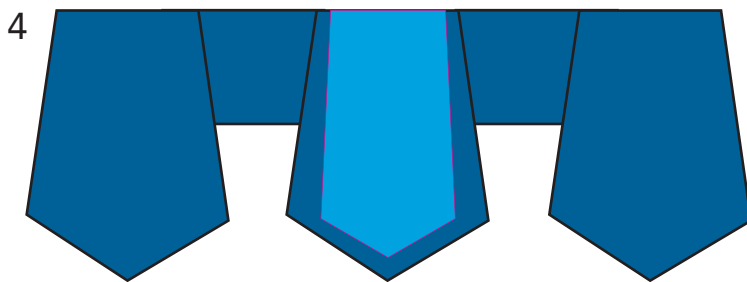
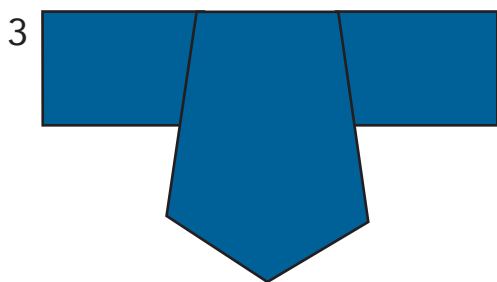
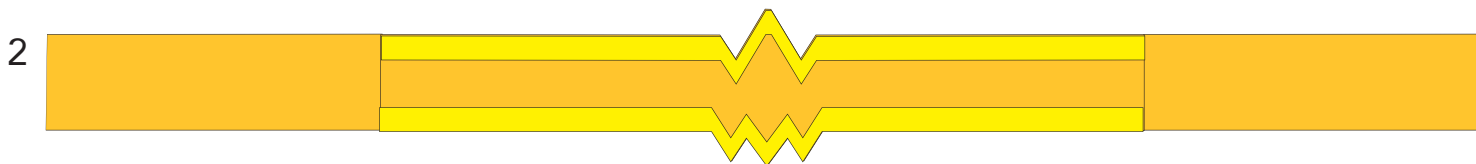
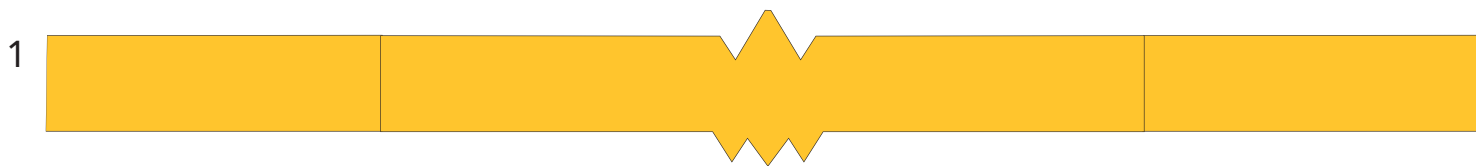
Next, brush glue on the back of the third and top piece, and place it on top, lining the top edge of the long sides to the top edge of the bottom base piece.

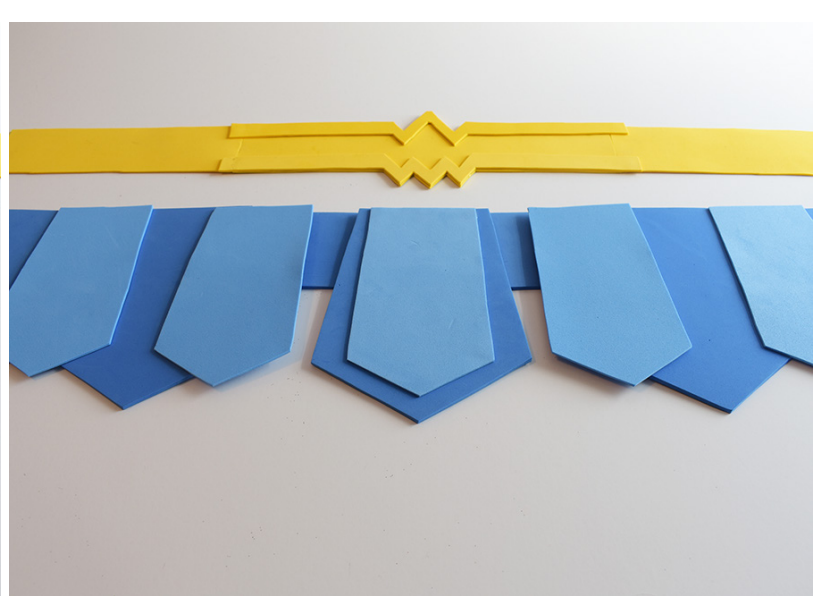
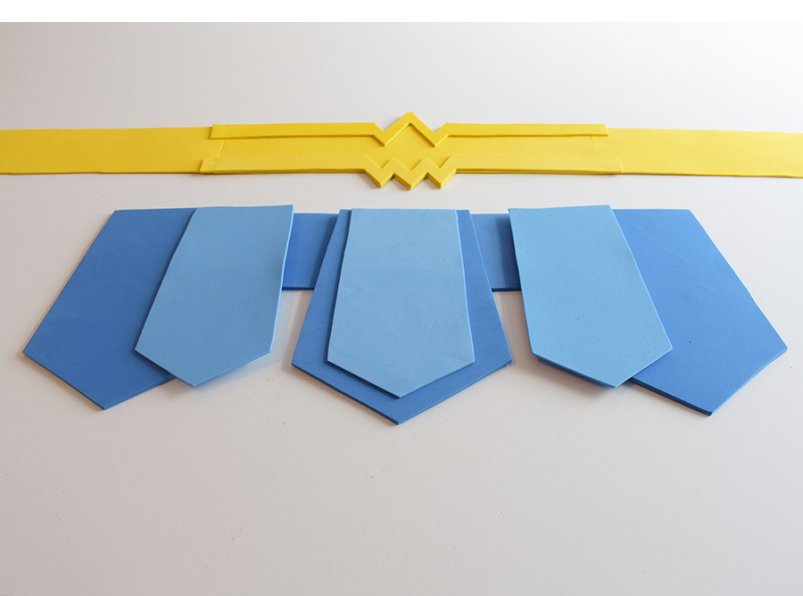
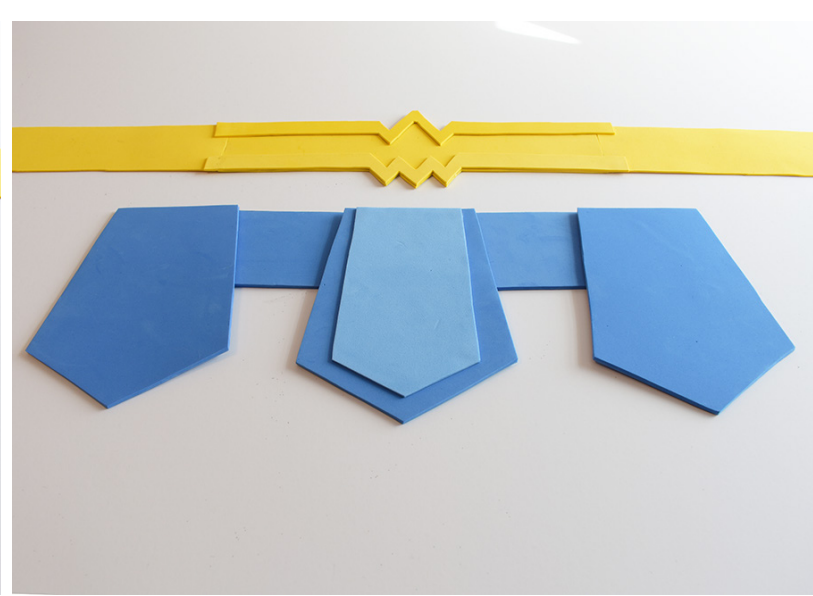
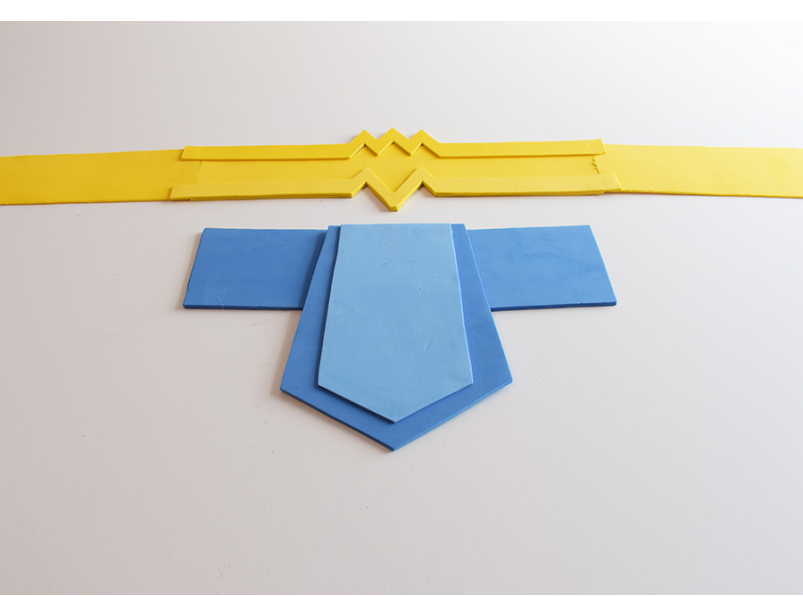


3. To put together the chest piece, follow the diagram below:



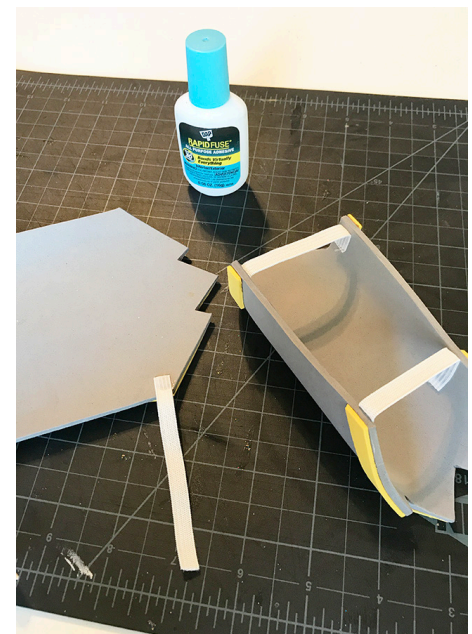
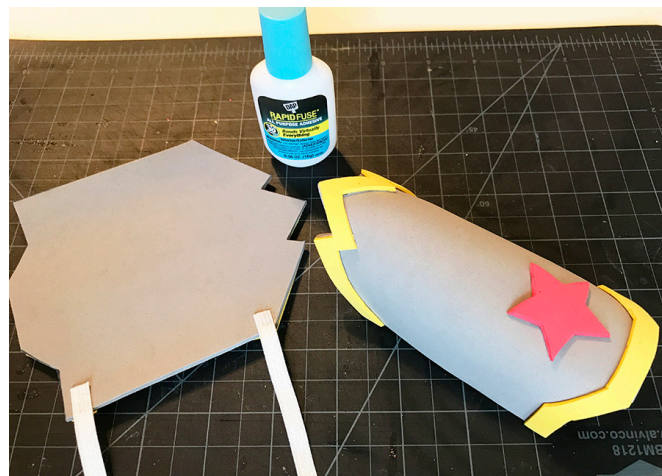
4. To put together the belt, follow the diagram below. Depending on the waist size of the person wearing the costume, you may need to cut out more skirt shapes. You will also want to cut the back belt piece in two pieces, as shown below. Glue each step using the RapidFuse brush applicator.



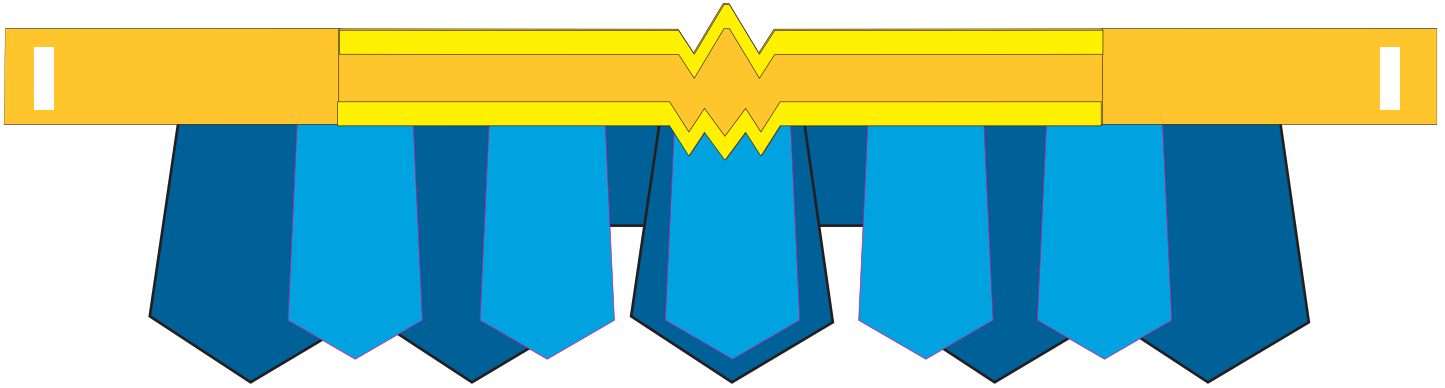


5. Place a piece of wax paper inside the t-shirt and glue the chest piece to the shirt using RapidFuse. Make sure to get the glue brushed on to the edges, especially pointier pieces.

6. Glue the bracers together as shown below. The star end is the end that goes closest to the wrist when worn. Once the glue is dry, roll your foam bracers into a cylindrical shape. Use RapidFuse to glue 1/2" elastic to the inside of the bracers to help it hold it's cylindrical shape and keep it on the wearer's wrist. You will need to hold the bracers in a cylinder shape while the glue dries to make sure it doesn't pull apart. Once dry, the elastic will help keep the bracer in a cylinder shape.



7. Measure the skirt around the wearer's waist and make a small mark where the ends meet to fit comfortably. Use RapidFuse and glue a 1/2" x 2" piece of velcro to the end pieces, as shown below.



8. The tiara won't be long enough to fit all the way around the wearer's head. That's okay! We used RapidFuse to glue 1/2" elastic to each end of the tiara, measuring how much we needed to the wearer's head. We hid the elastic under the child's hair, so when wearing it, the elastic didn't show at all. When gluing the elastic, use a generous dab of RapidFuse to ensure it has a strong bond. Be careful when gluing this part, as the glue will soak through the elastic.
